Well remembered by members from the September opening party, Linda saw every reason to join the CVWC, and, as one of its newest members, she embarked on a striking account of her incredible accomplishments as an author, speaker,

storyteller, advisor, actor, and, yes, plus-sized model, in an entertaining and informative plus-sized lunch.

Accompanied by a video, she recounted a new history of fashion, taking her audience through a century of time travel, replete with the changes from the old "corset" of fashion design to a new "Fashion Fusion" that embodied advanced images that freed women from the lampshade design a hundred years earlier.

Referring to the 1930's, she also noted that "when Wall Street crashed, so did the hemlines." She related trends of the

20th Century, which included "white kitchens," a symbol of germ-free cleanliness in the 40's, and, she touched on the transition into Mid-Century bold with the Eames chair, a symbol of Post Modern architecture.

Trendy current designers—Missoni, Gucci, Armani, Chanel—made an appearance., as did architects Gehry, Michael Graves and others. Her monologue ended with fabrics—Mario Buatta, Fortuny, and, later, the first florals and chintz imported from Asia. It was a symbolic place to close.

The afternoon ended with a

raffle basket designed by Pinkie Terry and won by Francine Kissler.

President Kathy Kaminski discussed upcoming luncheons and events and asked everyone to "stay tuned." 2021-22 will be loaded with special events.

The Historyof the Carmel Mission is Yours to Discover

CORRAL DE TIERRA is the spot, 11:30 is the time, you've probably already made your reservations, your menu has been selected, and now you can look forward to the pleasure of listening to our speaker, Stephanie Zelei, Exeutive Director of the Carmel Mission Foundation, expound on the history of one of

the area's most fascinating stories: the founding of our fabled Carmel Mission.

It is also the story of Carmel, the story of Father Junipero Serra, the landing of the Spanish fleet in 1749 and the travels of the conquistadors as they braved the trail of El Camino Real from the tip of Mexico to the Monterey Peninsula, creating of one of the first civilized settlements in the State of California.

The historic Carmel Mission will coma alive as Ms. Zelei gives a glimpse into the Mission's past, from its founding in 1771 with the help of Fr. Junipero Serra, to its deteriorated condition in 1850, when it faced physical ruin. It was then the newly formed state of California, called it its own. You won't want to miss the saga of its

restoration up to the present.

Ms. Zelei's presentation, "Preserving the Past for Future Generations," offers a description of early Central Coast development and the political climate of the infant state. You will be brought up to date on all the traumas, historical battles, architectural triumphs of our fabled mission.

This, as you dine on the Corral's famous chicken Rigatoni with roasted mushroom, marsala cream and parmesan cheese, or an herb baked salmon with salsa verde, fingerling potatoes and artichokes. If you have room, don't forget the dessert! Too good to miss!

It's coming up in a few short hours.



She has provided solutions for






So pick up the phone for the holidays. He'll be waiting to take your order.
